EQUITY TEAM UPDATE

STRATEGIC PLAN UPDATE

Mutiu Fagbayi, President and CEO of Performance Fact, gave an update on the district <u>Strategic Plan process</u>.

This equity-centered strategic planning work began last fall, and five teams of district staff and community members have been meeting regularly to create a five-year blueprint for the district.

The teams have drafted a Portrait of a Graduate, goals and measures, and the "Four Pillars," which are building blocks for effective instruction throughout the district. The Board is expected to consider the adoption of the strategic plan later this spring.

CEDARHOME ELEMENTARY SCHOOL REPORT

Jeff Lofgren, principal of Cedarhome Elementary School, presented the school <u>report</u>. Mr. Lofgren is retiring at the end of the school year after 24 years as principal at Cedarhome.

Mr. Lofgren reported on the school's demographics. Cedarhome is the district's largest elementary school with 574 students. He discussed the school's scores on state assessments and praised the Cedarhome school community's perseverance during the past two years of the pandemic.
