SPECIAL EDUCATION UPDATE

Robert Hascall, Executive Director of Special Services, gave an <u>update</u> on Special Education in the district.

Mr. Hascall detailed the work being done to identify the gaps in special services and create solutions, including:

- Looking for statistical anomalies in specific grades with high-needs students.
- Focus on grades 6-11 resource programs
- Focus on self-contained programs

Other areas of progress include:

- ASSIST elementary program expanding to Twin City
- Early Learning, using Ready-K kits with funding from the Stanwood-Camano Area Foundation
- Transitional Kindergarten
- Enhanced Communication with staff and families using newsletters and periodic meetings.

Christine Del Pozo, Principal of Stanwood High School, presented the school report.

Principal Del Pozo reported on academic performance by student demographic and how student learning has grown over time. The graduation rate for the class of 2021 was 93%.

She gave several highlights from this year, including

- New building, an open house for the community, and ongoing tours
- Athletics/Activities are all going very well
- Building-wide focus on social-emotional learning (SEL) work
- Equity focus
- Targeted professional development on instructional strategies
