The school board meeting previously scheduled for Tuesday, March 17 at 1:00 PM, has been cancelled.

Does this mean that we have a 45 day spring break?

No. We are working on learning opportunities this week and will then determine how to best make these opportunities accessible to students. Spring break is still April 6-10.

Will there be delays in the construction of Stanwood High School and Church Creek Campus?

No. Our contractors will continue to work.

Will my high school student lose credits?

We are working with OSPI to address the question of credits.

We were just informed that all Snohomish County YMCAs have been directed to close through March 31. **The childcare remains open.**
