April 6, 2020

Earlier today, Governor Inslee and State Superintendent Reykdal announced that students will not be returning to school facilities for the remainder of the 2019-20 school year. The district had already begun planning to transition to remote learning.

Steps the District has taken to put distance learning in place include:

- Trained staff on the use of Google Meet, which is a virtual meeting platform.
- Tightened security protocols to help ensure a safe online environment.
- Collected information from all students regarding device and internet resources at home and delivered Chromebooks.
- Prepared learning resources for students that were in keeping with the state's initial guidelines.
- Selected Google Classroom and Seesaw as platforms for the delivery and collection of assignments for use in a remote learning environment
- Collecting information from students without internet connectivity to determine ways to increase their access to online learning resources.
- Google classroom training is in process.
- We have a new license for Seesaw, which is currently being set up and piloted. Training will be next week.
- We have established a tech help line for our community. This number is 360-403-3966

Plans will be refined and finalized when we return from spring break. New learning resources will still be provided on April 13, with the launch of distance learning and increased online opportunities on April 27.
