Unstuck Strategies

Teachers explicitly teach students how to use unstuck strategies so they can use the strategies to support their own learning.



When I'm Stuck,

Take A Deep Breath And...

RECOGNIZE

Read the questions or instructions to yourself (again).

Identify:

- What is being asked?
- What do I already know?
- What do I need to know?
- What methods do I have to begin?

REFLECT

Be patient with yourself. Learning something new can be challenging.
Keep at it!

Do I need to ask a classmate for support or raise my hand for help?

Does my answer look complete and make sense?

REVIEW

Identify what I do know and where I'm stuck.

Underline key words and/or use a framework to organize my thoughts.

Our AAP Strategies (teachers will...)

Saratoga School

- → Implement Number Talks to increase learning in math through student discussions
- → Target student skill areas using IXL
- → Create common school expectations
- → Offer in-person family meetings

- Engender trust and partnerships with students to engage in learning
- → Develop, explicitly teach, and consistently apply schoolwide supports
- Provide additional academic support to students as needed
- Strengthen Tier I Instruction across all classrooms



Progress Toward our Goals (teachers are...)

Saratoga School

- Number Talks in K-8 are positively impacting student learning and discussion practices in math and other content areas.
- Reading:
 - Focus on phonemic awareness instruction in kindergarten to support reading.
- > IXL individualized targeted support for each student in reading and math.
- Common behavior expectations established, taught, and posted throughout the school.

- Relationship Mapping Identifying students who have staff they connect with as well as students who do not. Concerted effort in making sure all students have a staff member they connect with.
- Unstuck Strategies Explicitly being taught and used during classroom instruction.
- Student Choice Teachers providing opportunities for student choice to demonstrate their learning whenever possible.
- Academic vocabulary focused on and embedded in student learning.
- Common behavior expectations established, taught, and posted throughout the school.

Kindergarten MAP Reading Assessment (Winter)

A focus on phonemic awareness has <u>0 students</u> performing in the lowest percentile in reading for the winter MAP reading assessment.
