

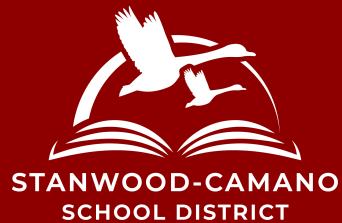

Legislative Impacts

HB1238 Introduced Jan. 11 | ✓ Passed House March 2 | ✓ Passed Senate April 11 | ✓ Signed into Law May 9

What this means for Stanwood-Camano students:

- 2023-24 - elementary schools with 40% Free and Reduced
 - All students in that school receive free meals
 - We do not have any schools that will reach this level next year
- 2024-25 - elementary schools with 30% Free and Reduced
 - All students in that school receive free meals
 - We currently have no schools at this level, but may have some in 2024-25
- Next year we will monitor the changes that occur due to boundary adjustments

Summer Food Service Program (SFSP)

Free breakfast and lunch will be offered at two sites this summer

- Children aged 18 years and younger are eligible
- Students outside these school boundaries are eligible
