


High School Credit Recovery

190 high school students who were credit deficient registered

324 semester credits earned

3 students graduated this year due to this program



Catch the Wave-Summer School Program

43 students attended with 95% attendance rate

14% receive MLL Services

30% receive Special Education Services

73% of students reported Summer School helped them get ready for 4th grade





Catch the Wave-Reading Program

76% — Fluency growth, on average

80% — New scientific vocabulary assessment

87% — Report being excited for 4th grade


"Although I work hard at building students' self esteem as readers, it is not always easy to break barriers they've built up. In creating art, students immediately see results and feel a sense of accomplishment.

"Boosting their confidence with art in the afternoon allowed students to leave each day on a positive note. Including art in the summer school program was a tremendous benefit to our students."






Changes from Summer 2022 to Summer 2023





Changes Made from 2022-23 to 2023-24

- Began recruiting students in March
- Provided more transportation stops
- 6% higher attendance rate in elementary
- Attendance requirement at registration
- Use of newly adopted curriculum
- Added enrichment activities and partnerships
