
2023 District Safety Audit

- Participants from every site / department completed the survey






How many times this year have you accessed the Emergency Procedures Guide?

Staff were asked what is going well concerning safety and security in your building or the district. Direct quotes include:

- We practice emergencies frequently and tweak plans as needed.
- Conducting drills to prepare students. Conversations with the students about the purpose of the drills and the safety of our campus.
- I appreciate that doors are locked and we have a fence around the playground now.
- Safety is taken very seriously, which is greatly appreciated.
- My feeling is that we are well prepared with our Admin leading the charge with information through periodic drills and regular information via our newsletter (smore) and even just casual conversations.
- I like that the doors are locked and people need to be let into the building. That makes it feel more secure and safe.



Staff were asked to describe any <u>safety concerns</u> you have related to procedures. Some direct quotes include:

- What to do with students who are not in classes at the time of an emergency. Staff reporting procedures not all staff report attendance the same.
- I would like to know what I do with students on the playground if we have a lockdown.
- There could be more training/information about emergency procedures before and/or after drills that we can communicate with our students to ensure they have a full understanding of all procedures when there is an emergency.
- I am most concerned with what happens after an earthquake in the event the building is collapsed and people are trapped and/or injured.



Next Steps and Timeline

- Retraining by leaders for building / department staff specific to building feedback - Ongoing
