Why AP?



- Gives you confidence to tackle academic challenges you can expect in college.
- Shorten the time it takes to earn a two year or four-year degree by taking freshman-level required courses and prerequisites.
- Research shows if you are successful in AP, you will typically experience greater academic success in college than students who do not take AP courses.

□ **Section I:**

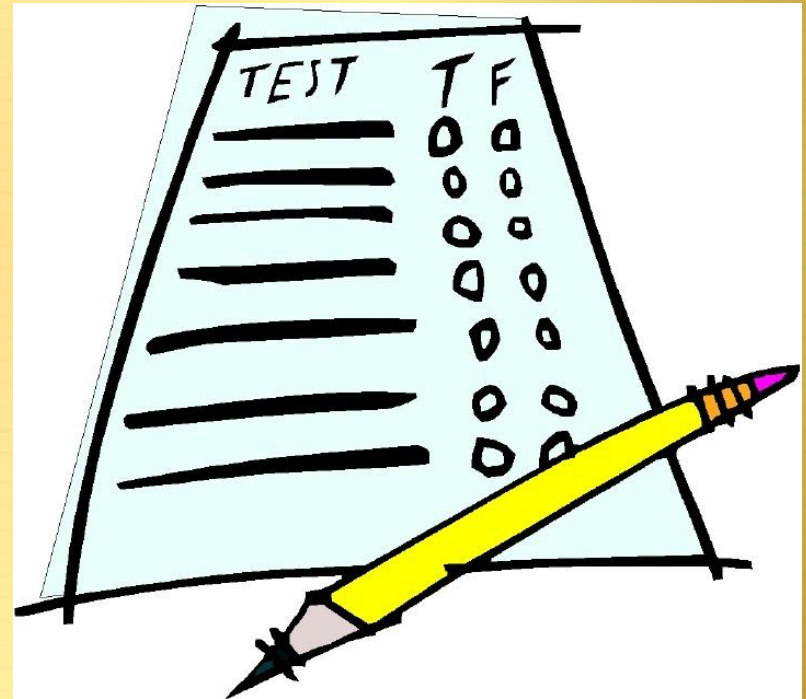
- 55 M-C questions - 55 minutes
- 3 short answer questions - 40 minutes

□ **Section II:**

- 1 document based question - 60 minutes
 - 1 long essay question – 40 minutes
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- It is a 4 hour long test

Who Will See My Scores?

- You need to contact Collegeboard to release your AP scores.
- You decide which universities or colleges, if any, will see your scores.



AP Exam Registration



- All students must register in November for their May exams.
 - **Cost:** \$98.00
- If you order after the deadline, you will need to pay a \$40 fee per exam in addition to the exam fee.
- If a student decides to cancel their exam after they have registered, they will need to pay a \$40 fee per exam.
